GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT NEWS

The end of the semester is rapidly approaching. With the whirlwind of activities happening before the holidays, we want students who will be leaving us at semester to be especially aware of the process involved.

Information for students graduating or transferring at semester

Seniors who are completing their graduation requirements at semester AND students transferring out at semester *must* complete the check-out process

by the end of the day on December 21, 2006. The student will be called to guidance and given a form prior to so that he or she can clear with teachers before the end of that day. All books must be turned in and lockers emptied, and the student must clear with the bookkeeper (i.e., all fees must be paid, lost books paid for, etc.) by the end of that day, December 21. **Please notify the guidance office as soon as possible if your student will be leaving us to go to another school.**

ACT and SAT Exams

The next ACT exam is February 10, 2007 and will be administered at LHS. The **deadline** to register is January 5, 2007.

The next SAT exam is January 27, 2007, also here at LHS. The **deadline** to register is December 20, 2006.

If you are currently a junior student who plans to go to college, it is important that you take the ACT and/or SAT before you begin your senior year. If you have any questions about or need assistance with either of these exams, please see your counselor.

Advanced Placement (AP) Exams

Advanced Placement exams will be administered May 7th – 18th at LHS. Students who are interested in taking an AP exam can discuss this option with their AP teacher and/or guidance counselor. Pre-enrollment for 2007-08

Pre-enrollment for next year's classes will occur shortly after the first of the year. We will begin enrolling students by grade, during seminar time, beginning in late January. Students are encouraged to visit with their counselor prior to enrollment to discuss various options.

AP Scholars Recognized

LHS is proud to announce that four students have earned the designation of AP Scholar by the College Board in recognition of exceptional achievement on the college-level Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) Exams.

Melissa Lisenbee qualified for the AP Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams. Megan Hallinan, Hyunji Kim, and Ryan Meeks qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Exams, with grades of 3 or higher.

Filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is a form that all families must complete if your student is planning on attending any post-secondary institution in order to qualify for any financial aid. Families only need to complete one form that then gets sent to a processing center.

As soon as possible after January 1, you should complete the FAFSA. Doing the FAFSA electronically speeds up the processing time from weeks to mere days. To complete the FAFSA electronically, both you and your student need to apply for PIN numbers at www.pin.ed.gov. Once you receive your PIN, you may go to www.fafsa.ed.gov to complete the actual form.

Once processed, you will receive the [Student Aid Report \(SAR\)](#). This will summarize the information you completed on your FAFSA and will include your [Estimated Family Contribution \(EFC\)](#). You will need to review the SAR and verify that everything is correct. Your information will then be distributed to the financial aid offices of the schools your child selected on the FAFSA.

Once the school(s) has received your SAR, the information will once again be processed and the school's financial aid office will send you an [award letter](#) stating how much financial aid you are eligible for and what types. These may include [grants](#), [scholarships](#), [loans](#), and [work-study](#) programs.

Once you have received the school's award letter, you should then determine whether your student will be accepting or rejecting all or part of the award package. You do not have to accept all of the financial aid that is offered. For example, if you qualify for \$10,000 in student loans but only need \$2,000, then you should accept only what you actually need. You or your child are responsible for paying student loans back upon graduation. All other types of financial aid mentioned above do not require you to pay them back.

You can sign up for this at any time during the school year by contacting the high school. Once you have a username and password, you can access the site by going to the building website, www.lvksch.org/lhs, and clicking on the Parent Access icon.

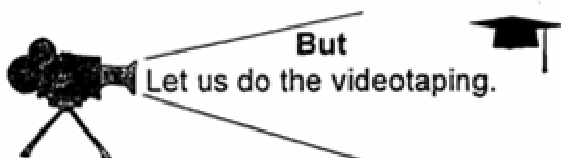
Holiday Decorating Safety Tips:

Academic Team Earns Spot on Televised Quiz Show "Quest"

Leavenworth High School's Scholars' Bowl team placed third among the largest schools in the state in the 2006-07 Quest academic competition on December 2 at Washburn University.

Teams representing over 60 Kansas high schools participated in the contest, co-sponsored by KTWU-PBS station and Washburn University. The competition allows teams of high school students from across Kansas to compete against one another in answering questions on topics such as art, literature, history, math and science.

LHS was among the teams earning the top 16 scores and so will advance to the finals in the televised Quest competition, which will air on KTWU from February to May 2007. (Exact dates will be announced later.)

LHS Band Students Selected as All-District Members

School Board Honors

Special Educators and Truancy Officer

At its meeting on December 6, the School Board awarded the faculty of LHS's Special Education Department and Mr. R.C. Wilkins the R.O.S.E. Award (Recognizing Outstanding Support of Education). Mr. Wilkins' award recognized his outstanding performance as truancy officer at LHS. The Special Education Department's dedication and many hours spent in making the program a tremendous success were cited in their award. This award reflects devotion and service above and beyond their duties and brings great credit to Leavenworth High School and USD 453.

LHS Recognized for 100 years of Accreditation

Leavenworth High School was recently recognized in Wichita by the North Central Accreditation for 100 years of continuous accreditation.

North Central Accreditation is the largest accreditation in the United States and LHS was one of the first schools in Kansas to participate in the NCA process. North Central Accreditation oversees nineteen states providing guidelines for schools to follow.

JROTC Raider Team Competes Well

Last month, the LHS JROTC Raider (Ranger) team competed in the Wentworth Military Academy Raider Challenge, their first Raider competition. The team met at 3 a.m. and didn't stop until 7 p.m. that night. The Leavenworth team placed high in several events: first in Cross Country Rescue, second in the Secret Event and Leadership Reaction Course, and third in the Military Stakes competition, which is a combination of physical fitness and knowledge. C/1LT Zack Bailey placed third overall out of 96 cadets on the Army physical fitness test.

The Leavenworth team placed third overall out of twelve, beating teams that have competed for years.

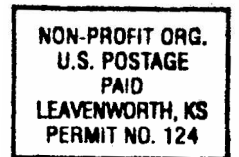
